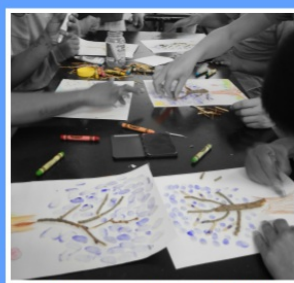
### Theory of Change

### Social Reinsertion

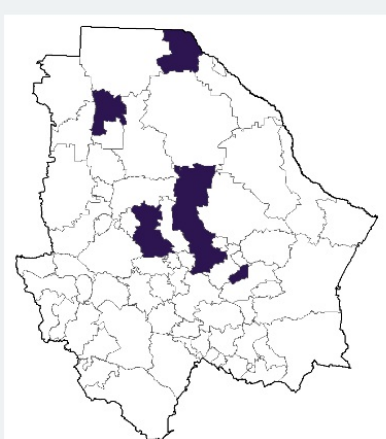


99.8% of
